# 2017 Annual Report

## Who is the Chamber of Commerce?

The Chamber of Commerce is a forward thinking and progressive non-profit organization, **independent of government**. We exist because of our members. The Humboldt & District Chamber of Commerce (HDCC) has been doing work in Humboldt since 1906, 111 years. Membership has grown over 70% in the past few years with the Chamber reaching 260 members in 2015. While once an organization that focused on the City of Humboldt, we are now reaching out to the entire region and encompass businesses within a 50+km radius of Humboldt. We understand that our rural municipalities, RM's and ag community are a strength to our region. We understand that working together we can benefit each other. We have 2 full time employees to serve your needs.

## Why Join?

If you are doing business in this area, you are participating in the economy of the community. The Humboldt & District Chamber of Commerce is the one organization that is responsible for the promotion and well-being of business in the region. The Chamber works for its members, being the spokesperson for business and professional communities and in order for us to ensure that this region is the best place to live, work and invest, we need to stay in touch with our business community and members, this allows us to be more effective when we advocate to government on our members behalf. **The Government needs and wants to hear from you, particularly in our rapidly changing economic environment.** This is one of our primary purposes besides helping with the grassroots day to day concerns and opportunities for business. Your membership allows us to connect more easily and efficiently with you. Governments are not always aware of the effect of some of their decisions on all businesses, they need our feedback. ## Visitor Information Centre & Campground (VIC) – Chair Brain Loos

The importance of the wellbeing of the Humboldt Chamber of Commerce is highly dependant upon the Visitor Information Centre and Campground. Our committee thanks Colleen, Stewart and the summer student staff for their hard work and dedication to our success. 2017 saw a healthy rise in occupancy, thus more than doubling our profit from the previous year. Some of the growth is due to not including GST in our fees, leaving them the same and collecting GST on the total fee. This improved the efficiency of the operation in lessening the administration work. The campground saw an increase in occupancy by contractors working in Humboldt area who stayed until well into October.

There was a slight increase in the Mini golf revenue for 2017. In order to grow the fees from the Mini Golf course we have budgeted for renovations and upgrades for a number of holes for each of the next 4 years starting from the most needy.

In the campground substantial cleanup and maintenance is needed each spring which was done this past spring by the campground staff and our Maintenance employee. This included deadfall and trimming of bush and trees. Some of the sites were enlarged as a result and a more cleaner setting was achieved. These efforts helped the existing campers to extend their stays or return and recommend our facility to others.

Because of 2017 success we look forward to as good or better year in 2018.

## Conclusion

Our success and effectiveness is directly related to our membership base and therefore we appreciate and value your membership with the Chamber. We enjoy working with you and look forward to working together to ensure our region stays strong for it's families and members.
