
Chamber Strategic Plan Committee Report

This past year was another one of sucess for the Humboldt & District Chamber of Commerce.

BHP contracted the Chamber to coordinate a Forum for Corporate Responsibility which took place in May. There was much discussion from businesses around reconciliation with Indigenous communities.

In June, we partnered with Horizon School Division for Indigenous Peoples Day.

This was such a lovely event with powerful speeches and performances with Indigenous people from all over our region.

In 2023, we were finally able to bring back the Mark of Excellence Awards. The event itself was very successful and well attended. There were many nominations that came in and Senator Pamela Wallin spoke inspirational with many jotting down notes as she spoke. We are looking forward to the 2024 Mark of Excellence Awards which will be taking place at the Humboldt Golf Course – Events Tent on September 12th.

In October, The Chamber attended a meeting in Saskatoon that was facilitated by Prabha Ramaswamy, the Executive Director of the Saskatchewan Chamber. Also in attendance was MSMA, Saskatchewan Real Estate Board, Melfort Chamber of Commerce and BHP administration. This conversation was related to housing and how much housing with be needed due to Phase 2 of the Jasen Mine.

Following funding from the Government of Saskatchewan through the Saskatchewan Economic Development Alliance, a manufacturing industry cluster was created with stakeholders in the region. Main concerns of the involved manufacturers were identified, and meetings with provincial representatives are continuing into 2024 to address priorities.

2023 was a successful year thanks to our members, Board of Directors and staff!
